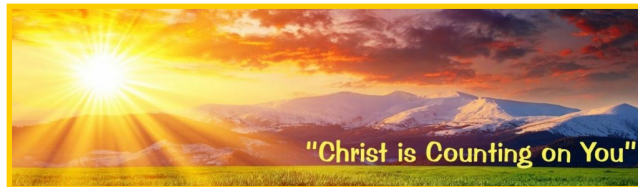

A LETTER FROM ANN BUTLER, #173 RECTOR



Greetings Friends,

My name is Ann Butler, I have the honor and joy of serving our community again as the Rector of the upcoming fall weekend, Cursillo #173. I served as the Rector of Cursillo #100, the last century's last Cursillo Weekend held in our diocese! I do not say that because it makes me sound old, (though it does blow me away a bit). What it does mean is that almost a quarter of a century later we are blessed to still have the interest and the community supporting the Cursillo movement in our diocese. Not all dioceses can make that joyful claim.

I made my Cursillo in 1987. I have met some of my dearest friends through Cursillo. I have been blessed to hear preaching from numerous priests with different voices and experience that I never would have had the opportunity to know otherwise. I have sponsored countless friends from my church and other churches to make their Cursillo weekends. I have prayed for many of those friends over the years and I have had to say goodbye to quite a few also, those saints who go before us and taught us so much about living a Christian life. ***Cursillo did not change my life, it changed the way I live my life and my relationship with God.*** I am certain it changed the way many of you live your lives also.

Remember though, we are Cursillo, just as we are the Church. It is not the weekend; it is a lifetime. And that life will only continue if we live and share

it. The pandemic stopped a lot of group activities for a while, and we are still trying to figure out how to reshape some things since then. Ultreyas have been struggling to get a set schedule or people to come out to them. It takes work, it does not just happen. It needs you and your input to give it life. Grouping and Ultreya are what can sustain us through the difficulties of our ordinary and extraordinary times. These two things, through our friends and other Cursillistas, help keep us on track in living a spiritually centered life by regularly doing and reviewing our prayer, study, and actions. They give us chances to make new friends and inform us of opportunities to help others outside of our families and immediate communities.

To keep Cursillo growing for more than another quarter century do not keep it to yourselves, we're not a secret society. Share it with others in your church. Look around your congregations, who do you know whose own journey might benefit from hearing others share the practices that nourish their spiritual journey? Invite them to Ultreyas. Invite them to group, they do not need to be Cursillistas to do these things. Offer to sponsor them for a Cursillo weekend where they too might end up meeting new best friends, hear how others live their spiritual life, what it means to be a Christian leader in their

communities, and answer God's call to be Christ's hands and feet in this life. Likewise, sponsor someone whose spiritual practices you already appreciate who might be looking for a community that would buoy up their journey.

If you are not sponsoring someone for the weekend, please keep checking the website for the candidates' names to be posted so you can be praying for them and the team.

That is an enormously powerful moment when you realize how many strangers are praying for you. I received a note from my 6-year-old son that said I love you because my sponsor Kaki Swann thought ahead and arranged it. It blew me away. Sponsors, make sure you encourage your Cursillo community and your priest to write palanca to your candidate.

And whether you have sponsored someone or not, come out to the **Fourth Day Gathering on November 2nd**. It is our family reunion. Come out and spend some time with your dearest friends.

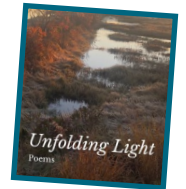

I'm one of those folks who never thought I'd be as busy – or busier – in retirement but here I am! It's just a different kind of busy. But one of the things that has helped me stay focused on the Lord in the midst of the busy-ness are daily meditations and Scripture reflections. So now, my email is populated with a few of those and I am grateful to have them with me when I have a moment. And I love having online resources to listen to as I travel! Here are a few that I enjoy or have enjoyed:

Thought for Today, is from Wild Goose Publications, news@ionabooks.com, the publishing arm of the Iona Community. Each day's email links to a passage from one of their publications, and it just takes a minute of my lunchtime to read a brief selection. For example, on June 24, titled "The Essence of Pilgrimage", the author writes "As I have grown older I have come to appreciate that the sacred is everywhere. *There is nowhere that the Beloved is not.*" The italics are mine and that brief sentence made me stop and remember again that in the midst of an administrative task, that even technology can bring us an "awareness of the Divine in the here and now."

Unfolding Light by retired United Methodist pastor Steve Garnaas-Holmes, www.unfoldinglight.net, is an email meditation frequently offered in verse. A daily reflection on a Scripture passage, this is a place where the words and their poetic format both feed me! In response to the passage from Mark about Jesus walking across the water, Garnaas-Holmes writes:

What dark night has the Loving One entered when you thought you were struggling alone?

What rough seas has the Beloved walked across to be with you?

What storms has the Calm One walked through with peace to give you?

Peace; be still. The Faithful One will do it again.

Did you know you can get **Forward Day by Day** in a daily email, in a podcast or through an app on your phone? Go to www.forwardmovement.org and see all the formats available. You can also find many more resources they have to offer. **Forward** is also offered in print in Spanish and a large print format which may be helpful to others you know. You can also link to Lent Madness via the Forward webpage. (If you don't know about Lent Madness, ask me!)

The Podcast **Morning Prayer from the Episcopal Church in Garrett County** offers a very simple daily morning prayer. I love Morning Prayer and I often miss worship in a community setting. This podcast, less than 20 minutes for each day, gives me the gift of the Office said with another voice. I have only one complaint: they have used the same music in the background for years! And they need a new background!

De Colores to everyone. I am so happy to be coming to you as the new Assistant Spiritual Director of Cursillo for the Diocese of Southern Virginia. As most of you know The Rev. Les Ferguson, previous Assistant Spiritual Director, has moved to the west coast, we miss him, and we definitely miss his Cursillo hats.

Along with being the Assistant Spiritual Director, I am also a Deacon in the Diocese of Southern Virginia. I was ordained to the Diaconate in June 2012 and serve as the driver and Deacon to Bishop Susan B. Haynes, our Bishop of the Diocese.

On Sunday's Bishop Haynes and I travel the Diocese from the Eastern Shore to the western side of the state out to Danville. When we visit the churches, besides helping Bishop Haynes with the service, I like to talk to the congregation and the clergy about Cursillo.

There are always questions and good discussion during our time together and I have found this is a new way to get the ministry of Cursillo out to the churches in the Diocese.

There has been good response to the talks and a few clergy have also become interested in making their Cursillo or serving on team.

As the new Assistant Spiritual Director I look forward to sharing the word of Cursillo with all the churches I visit with Bishop Haynes and renew the joy of Cursillo in the Diocese.

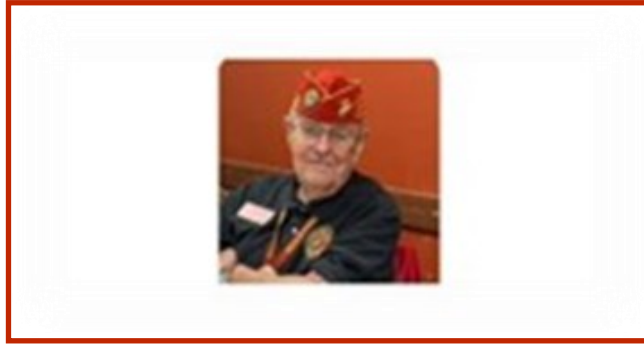

Remembering Brooks Harris

Cursillo #41 in the Diocese of Southern Virginia

From Ann Butler, Rector of upcoming weekend #173

Many of us just are seeing this for the first time. We have lost a dear brother in Christ and a faithful servant. Ann Butler graciously has given us his Cursillo journey with us.

Brooks made Cursillo #41 at Blackstone and was the Rector of Cursillo #71. When Brooks made his Cursillo the days went well into midnight, with one more talk after dinner. He helped streamline the schedule, so all talks were given before dinner and everyone got to bed at a reasonable hour.

When you look up the word hospitality in the dictionary, there is an image of Brooks Harris. He is best remembered by fellow Cursillistas for serving on the Kitchen team. After serving his country as a Marine he began to serve people in the catering business. The snack tables were always prepared with love decorated with tablescapes that included some sort of a carved fruit/vegetable rooster or Celtic cross.

Brooks was the one who introduced the plates that hold the wine glasses for the Agape giving everyone a hand to nibble what was on the plate instead of just holding a plate and glass the whole time.

Brooks was head of the Kitchen team that travelled to the Caribbean for Virgin Islands Cursillo #1. When none of the trunks with

supplies arrived in time for the weekend Brooks sent his team out to cut wildflowers from along the road (in the states we call them exotic flowers) put rainbow colored ribbon around discarded mini plastic water bottles and put candles in them, rolled tinfoil down the middle of the tables to reflect the light and had one of the most beautiful Agape tables I have ever seen. The candidates thought they were transported into some place they had not seen in the facility yet and not just in the cafeteria they had been eating in every day.

Brooks had a great sense of humor, a big laugh, and a heart as big as his personality. He and his wife Pat were greatly missed when they retired to Cary, NC to be near family.

Two of the things I learned from Brooks and share often with others to this day: "I love to give talks on the weekend because I believe God has something to share with the candidates through me" and what Pat use to say, "Here I am Lord, send Brooks!"

Brooks Harris Obituary

Colonel John Brooks Harris, USMC Retired, was surrounded by multiple generations of his family when he passed away on May 4, 2024 at the age of 92. Colonel Harris (known by "Brooks" to all) was born in [Rockville Centre, NY](#) to Retired LtCol Clinton G. Harris, US Army, and his wife, Meta. He is survived by his beloved wife, Patricia Parrish Harris, with whom he very recently celebrated 36 years of marriage. Brooks leaves behind three children, Michael D. Harris, Kathleen Ann Keene and her husband Richard, and Karen Elizabeth Robbins. He is also survived by two stepchildren, Catharine Staley and her husband Fred, and Kyle Parrish and his wife Laura. He loved and was proud of his eleven grandchildren and five great grandchildren.

Brooks graduated from Newburgh Free Academy in 1949. After a couple of overly enjoyable years at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, he enlisted in the U. S. Marine Corps in February 1952. He was commissioned in September 1952 and retired in 1983. He finished his degree at Old Dominion University Summa Cum Laude in 1972. In the Marines, Brooks served with the 1st Marine Division in Korea and later with the 3rd Marine Amphibious Force in Vietnam. His awards include the Legion of Merit with Combat "V" and a gold star in lieu of a second award, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Combat Action Ribbon, and other service medals. His service includes a tour as CO of Marine Barracks, US Submarine Base, New London, CT, Executive Officer of the 12th Marine Regiment, and Commanding Officer of the 11th Marine Regiment. His last assignment was as Chief of Staff, Landing Force Training Command, Little Creek, VA. He was a Life Member of the Marine Corps League, Tar Heel Detachment.



After retiring from the Marines, Brooks focused on his "softer

side." In 1985, he graduated from Johnson and Wales University Magna Cum Laude with a degree in Culinary Arts. He put this to good use as a caterer in Virginia Beach, providing "food for fifty" at many church-related and local community events. He also tried his hand at painting and became a stained-glass artist. Many are happy to have pieces of his glass by which to remember him.

Colonel Harris had been very active in the Episcopal Church throughout his life and was an active member of the Cursillo community. At his death, he was attending Christ the King (CTK) Lutheran Church with his family members in Cary, but he reminded us all that he was an Episcopalian right up until the end. Before moving to CTK, Brooks was a member of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Cary and had been a thirty-two year member of Emmanuel Episcopal Church in Virginia Beach, VA where he had served on the vestry and for several years as treasurer. He was a charter resident of SearStone CCRC in Cary. Please join us in a celebration of life on Saturday, May 18 at 11:00 am at Searstone Retirement Community, **H i g h v i e w A u d i t o r i u m , C a r y , N C**

Please consider wearing red in honor of Brooks' service in the United States Marine Corps. In lieu of flowers, Colonel Harris requested that memorial donations be made to Lee's Friends, [<https://leesfriends.org/>] a cancer support organization in Norfolk, VA in which he had been very active.

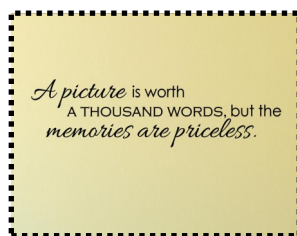
